#### HOW TO WINTERIZE YOUR HOME

Each winter, many homeowners in Donald face the expense, and inconvenience of frozen water pipes. Monitor the weather and specifically the freezing temperatures to be sure you winterize to protect your pipes. I have put together a checklist to help you winterize your home and be protected for winter season:

- Wrap exposed pipes and plumbing with proper insulation, available at a
  plumbing store. For a quick fix, use blankets, newspapers, and towels. If
  your pipes do freeze, be patient. Sometimes a hair dryer can be helpful to
  gradually warm the pipe up. Do NOT pour hot water over or down a frozen
  pipe, or use a flame torch, doing so risks further damage to the pipe.
- Outdoor: Wrap exposed pipes such as hose bibs, swimming pool supply lines, pipes on the outside of the house, water sprinkler heads, and irrigation systems.
- Indoor: Check and wrap exposed pipes (if needed) in the basement, crawl spaces, attics, garages, and kitchen cabinets. Please protect pipes that are not well insulated inside your home as well.
  - If you leave town for an extended amount of time, the City has a vacation rate that includes one turn off and turn on. This will save you money and give you peace of mind that you won't have a water leak in your home. Call City Hall prior to leaving to make arrangements.
